PREAMBLE

This XVth Convention of the All India Association of Superintendents of Central Tax (AIASCT), Kolkata Zone, comprising representatives from West Bengal, Sikkim and Andaman & Nicobar Islands, after extensive deliberations on service conditions, promotion matters, transfer policies, infrastructure deficiencies, medical facilities, manpower constraints and welfare concerns of members, unanimously adopts the following resolutions for immediate consideration and necessary action by the competent authorities.

RESOLVED THAT:

I. SERVICE & PROMOTION RELATED ISSUES:

1. Updated Seniority List & Grant of Notional Effect of Promotion:

The vacancy roster be urgently reviewed and rectified, and the Updated Seniority List of Superintendents be published incorporating year-wise vacancy position. Further, notional effect of promotion from Inspector to Superintendent be granted retrospectively to all similarly placed eligible officers who were affected due to delayed/non-conduct of DPCs, so as to restore rightful seniority, remove anomalies, and ensure parity and administrative fairness.

Address for Correspondence and Communications:

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2. Regularisation of Temporary AC Posts (All India level):

Temporary posts of Assistant Commissioner be regularised on priority so that stagnation at the level of Superintendent is reduced and promotional avenues are widened in a time-bound manner.

3. Pay Upgradation & Subramaniam Case (All India level):

Ad-rem implementation of pay upgradation w.e.f. 01.01.1996 and grant of Level-9 after completion of four years in Level-8 (as per the judgment in M. Subramaniam case) be implemented uniformly across the country, and arrears from 01.01.1996 be released without further delay.

4. Filtering of Work at Headquarters Level:

Considering that Range Offices are primary field formations and are already overburdened, a dedicated mechanism/section at Headquarters level be created to scrutinise and appropriately allocate work received from Audit/Anti-Evasion/Appeal/Refund branches so that duplication and unnecessary workload on field officers is avoided.

5. Grant of GP ₹5400 (PB-2) to Eligible Officers (All India level):

In-rem implementation be pursued for grant of Grade Pay ₹5400 (PB-2) upon completion of four years in GP ₹4800, including cases where promotion was through MACP, so that eligible officers are not compelled to seek judicial remedy individually.

II. TRANSFER & POSTING / AGT RELATED ISSUES:

8. Strict adherence to notified Transfer & Posting norms in the grade of Superintendents be ensured in letter and spirit.
9. Posting near home town in South & North Bengal be considered sympathetically and rationalisation of station classification be undertaken to minimise hardship.
10. Representations of officers for posting in Durgapur Audit be considered judiciously, giving preference to officers of Non CCA area (considering place of residence of the officer i.e. Circle V and VI for officers from North Bengal), subject to the compliance of transfer and posting policy, and unnecessary Audit Commissionerate to Audit Commissionerate transfers be avoided.
11. Officers returning from Non-CCA / less HRA stations be given due preference in postings as per their options.
12. Building preference (GST Bhawan, Custom House, Bamboo Villa)

be incorporated in AGT option forms, with priority for officers with medical conditions and expecting lady officers.

13. Sensitive & Non-Sensitive Sections be clearly segregated and reflected transparently in AGT orders.

14. Centralised posting in Gangtok & Darjeeling Divisions be made only for willing officers.

15. It is proposed that in the case of posting under Siliguri Appeal Commissionerate, the existing tenure of two years may be extended up to four years, subject to representation by the concerned officer after completion of two years, and administrative feasibility.

16. **Non-CCA to CCA Compulsory Transfer Clause:**

The clause mandating compulsory transfer to CCA area after 20 years of combined service be reconsidered, as it causes severe hardship to officers settled in Non-CCA regions. If unavoidable, such transfer may be restricted within Non-CCA areas.

17. **CCP Functional Posts:**

Key functional posts in CCP presently being filled from Customs formations on deputation be retained for GST officers to protect cadre interest.

III. HILLY / TOUGH LOCATION ALLOWANCE:

17. Darjeeling & Kalimpong districts be declared Tough Locations considering altitude, climatic hardship, connectivity constraints and high cost of living, and allowances be granted at par with similarly placed regions.

IV. CGHS & MEDICAL FACILITIES:

18. Tie-up with major private hospitals under CGHS rates with cashless facility be ensured.

19. CGHS coverage be extended to Bolpur, Durgapur & Asansol at the earliest.

20. Wider publicity of Paripoorna Bima Aayush Yojana be undertaken and feasibility of inclusion of non-CGHS employees be explored.

21. A Medical Emergency Pull Fund be created at All India level.

22. CGHS empanelled hospitals be directed not to deny treatment at CGHS rates to beneficiaries.

23. **Timely Reimbursement of Medical Bills:**

Reimbursement of Medical, TA and LTC bills be processed within a

fixed timeframe to avoid financial hardship.

V. PENSION & FAMILY WELFARE:

24. Pension benefits in death cases be processed and commenced within a clearly defined timeframe so that dependent family members receive uninterrupted financial support.

VI. INFRASTRUCTURE & WORKING CONDITIONS:

25. Basic facilities including proper seating, adequate computers, scanners and laptops be provided to all officers.
26. Renovation and maintenance of washrooms be undertaken on priority.
27. Installation of Air Conditioners in all office rooms in a phased manner.
28. Dedicated Lady Restrooms, Crèche and Divyang-friendly facilities be ensured.
29. Infrastructure Committees be constituted in each building.
30. Proper sitting arrangements for Superintendents be ensured after conducting a survey.
31. Parking issues in office premises be resolved amicably.
32. Official vehicles be provided in remote areas like Sikkim for movement during natural calamities.
33. Adequate office infrastructure in CCP and Bank of Baroda Building (Dankuni/Chandannagar/Singur) including lift, washrooms, AC and seating be ensured.

VII. MANPOWER & ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT:

34. Additional Inspectors be posted based on taxpayer strength.
35. Acute shortage of Inspectors in certain Divisions (e.g., Dankuni/Chandannagar/Singur) be addressed urgently.
36. TA/TTA bills be cleared strictly on FIFO basis.
37. Laptops under 1% incremental scheme and smartphones with allowance be provided.
38. Reimbursement of mobile expenses up to prescribed ceiling be granted (All India level).
39. Regular OCM meetings be conducted at Commissionerate level.
40. Adequate computer and printer facilities be ensured in Barasat

VIII. VIGILANCE & ASSOCIATION ETHICS

41. Vigilance cases be disposed of expeditiously; cases pending beyond two years be pursued with DG Vigilance (All India level).
42. Officers penalised in vigilance matters be debarred from contesting Association elections (All India level).

IX. ORGANISATIONAL MATTERS

43. Regular collection of membership subscription be ensured through coordinated effort with DDOs.
